# This week @ Kensington

It has been another cold one this week. Thank you for working with us to make sure this has not stopped your children from coming into school. Research into primary school attendance has found setting good attendance patterns from an early age, from nursery through primary school can help your child later on in their life because children who have a poor school attendance record have less chance of securing a job when they are adults.

Lots of engaging learning has been happening throughout the school this week. Our nursery children tasted porridge as an episodic hook for Goldilocks and the Three Bears; Year 1 have been busy sorting materials; Year 4 have had fun carrying out a science investigation to explore chemical reactions; and Year 6 children made video blogs to engage them in their English writing. Finally, our regular guest assistant teacher – Coco Leeks – returned to help Year 5 with their science learning.

Parent's evening is coming up on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> February. This is an opportunity for you to have an in depth conversation with our staff about your child's learning, their achievements and what their next steps are for the second half of this year. You will receive invitation slips next week, so you can begin making plans accordingly. 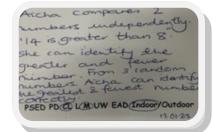


# Star Learners this Week are:
