








STAR LEARNER OFTHE WEEK Year 2-3—Y2G Zakariya Isap

Y6P star learner is Dhanya Sri. Dhanya is consistently 100% focussed in class. She is kind and helpful to those around her and is always ready to act as a learning buddy for others. Below is an excerpt from her non-chronological report on the Second World War, which all pupils in the school can look up to as an example of the structured writing expected of a year 6 pupil. Winston Churchill

Who was Winston Churchill? What was his job; and what did he do?

Winston Churchill was the Prime Minister during the war (Second World War) and a famous war hero (he achieved this during the **Boer** War). He became Prime Minister twice; first in 1940-1945; then re-elected in 1951-1955. He was strong and he played a main role during Britain's "Darkest Hour"; he made a great effort. Furthermore he was Head of the Navy, even before he was a Prime Minister. He fought against Adolf Hitler(Germany's **dictator** and leader of their Nazi Party); he didn't surrender to him. He has 99% of bravery for standing against Adolf Hitler. He created many persuasive speeches: Never Give In... that made the nation confident, strong and brave which supported Great Britain and the Allies towards their **victory**. He often kept his viewpoints and beliefs steady; he did everything he possibly could for Great Britain

Year 2

Year 2's have been learning all about electricity un science! They have begun learning about electrical safety and have attempted to create their very own circuits. Soon they will be investigating how different materials are insulators and conductors. They have really been enjoying these hands on science lessons.
