




STAR LEARNER OF THE WEEK Year 4 - 6— Y6E- Tafhim

As part of Project 'BOOK AMNESTY' we request parents/children to return any library books back to school.


And we encourage pupils to check all over the house and look for books that have the school's barcode.


Over the next week we will gladly accept returned books and any old and unused book donations (only in good condition)

When you have logged in, go to the SHOP where you can select the uniform items you wish to purchase, make the purchase and then come to the school office to collect the items you've purchased.
