
STAR LEARNER OFTHE WEEK Year 2- 3— Aleksandra Tsokova- Y3L


The Star Learner in year 3 is Aleksandra Tsokova for her amazing fraction wall which she made all on her own.

15th March, 9-10am or 5.30-6.30pm


21st March, 2-3pm
