

Literacy:

To understand that print has meaning and we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom.

To engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary.

Mathematics:

To name basic colours.
To begin to understand some positional language.
To begin to recite numbers to 5.

Understanding of the World:

To show respect for others, including traditions and celebrations.
To show awareness of similarities and differences between themselves and others.
Continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.
Show interest in different occupations.

Personal, Social, & Emotional Development:

Show more confidence in new social situations.
Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule
Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.
To show respect for others.

Physical Development:

Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.
Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.
Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks.

Communication & Language:

Understand a question or instruction that has two parts, such as "Get your coat and wait at the door".
Sing a large repertoire of songs.
Know many rhymes, be able to talk about familiar books and repetitive language.
Use a wider range of vocabulary.

Expressive Art & Design:

To begin to build and balance using construction.
To begin to play instruments with increasing control.
