Happy Friday to all our Kensington Primary School parents and carers! This week has very much been sport themed as we ran our Intra-sports days on Tuesday and Wednesday. All children took part in competitive races, relays and sports activities and had a wonderful time! Physical health is a fundamental part of our curriculum and we are committed to getting our children physically active each day. The NHS guidelines state children should be physically active for at least one hour a day. Sadly the latest figures show only 42% of children in London are active for one hour per day. This year we want to measure this in school using our 'My Zone' bands for the older children and possibly using pedometers for the younger children. We are confident that we are performing way above the London average and would like to measure this and further evidence the impact of Curriculum-K (our school's bespoke curriculum). On Tuesday we also marked World Mental Health Day and engaged with ITV's Let's Get Britain Talking campaign. Children were encourage to complete some homework all around talking through worries and concerns.

Academic outcomes are also very important to the school. We are pleased with the progress we are making with pupil outcomes following statutory assessments last academic year; we are working hard to build on this to ensure all our pupils are prepared for the next step in their education.

We are delighted that our attendance figures are improving; I would like to thank all parents and carers for working with the school to help us all meet the new government stipulations and processes around managing our children's attendance. We understand there are very good reasons why, at times, children cannot come into school, and we want to work with you to fully understand this and support you in any way we can.

STAR LEARNER OF THE WEEK EYFS & Year 1


Having entered Reception as a mid-phase admission, Hannah settled in seamlessly into Blue Class, and has developed friendships across the cohort.



Stay Warm in Newham

The Renewal Programme have launched their Stay Warm in Newham project and have opened their first warm bank on Tuesday 24th January.

Newham residents are encouraged to attend our warm bank sessions to access energyrelated advice/services and activities, to help reduce energy cost. We also provide a welcoming space for residents to enjoy tea and coffee with some company.

Our warm bank runs three days a week on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 11:00am- 1:00pm at The Renewal Programme, 395 High Street North E12 6PG.

You will have the opportunity to engage with our energy experts, Groundwork's Green Doctors, who will be there every Tuesday to offer advice to residents on how to reduce energy cost while keeping their home warm. They also provide in-depth referrals via telephone calls or home visits (subject to eligibility).

We are also providing hot meals every Wednesdays from 11:30am- 1:00pm and will be starting cooking classes very soon!

Breakfast Club

We provide a daily Breakfast Club, currently at a cost of £1 per day. Children are able to attend daily from 7.30am, and are provided with a variety of healthy breakfast options as well as indoor and outdoor activities. The latest admission to the Breakfast Club is 8.20am.
