Welcome back! I hope you all had a wonderful half-term break.

During assembly next week, we will discuss the importance of Ramadan, a sacred and meaningful time for millions around the world. Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic lunar calendar and holds great significance for our Muslim families and community members. We know that many of our children will want to fast during this time. As with previous years we just wanted to remind parents and carers that our advice from local faith groups and the SACRE board is that children in Y5 and Y6 may be able to fast during school hours. The school has guidelines around this important subject and we will be communicating this again to parents over the coming weeks.

Our star learner is Mohammad, who has been a joy to teach.

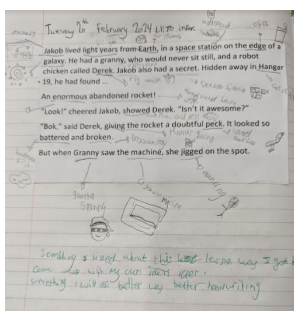

Well done Mohammad!



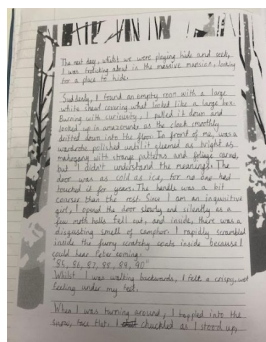
STAR LEARNER OF THE WEEK Year 2 - 3
