## Hello Parent and Carers!

As we approach the end of Spring term it is important that we reflect on what is working well in the school and crucially how we can improve. To do this we gather feedback from children, staff and parents in a number of ways. We know from previous feedback that some children wanted more challenge in class; therefore we have 'Adaptive Practice' as a whole school development target and all staff have received training on how they can better adapt their planning to meet the needs of all children in the class. Parents have also told us that they aren't 100% clear on some aspects of our curriculum; so we have opened the doors even more this year and invite parents in to 'learn with your child' and we have more plans to engage parents with the curriculum. Staff have told us that they need support with multilingual learners; so we have provided extra support with this and have recently installed a brand new Multilingual library. In short, your comments make a difference! Please could I ask all parents to spend a few minutes to complete our Spring Survey.
