Can I start by thanking all parents who contributed to our Spring Parent Survey. Results were overwhelmingly positive and we thank everyone for their kind comments! We have now had a chance to collect all the feedback (positive and next steps) and will be discussing the themes during upcoming leadership and governance meetings. Your feedback really does matter and has an impact. During autumn term we heard that parents were struggling with so many messages on Study Bugs; as a result we have moved all non-urgent whole school messages into the Newsletter. We know some parents feel their children aren't challenged enough at school; as a result we have 'adapting learning to challenge all children' as a whole school focus area on our School Development Plan. We know some parents aren't clear on their children's learning; as a result we are stepping up our parental engagement with a new plan to open our doors more often to parents. 
