What an amazing week we have had at Kensington Primary School. Children are now fully immersed with their new theme for Summer term and have made an excellent start with their new learning journey. Each term teacher will work towards a 'Theme Map' that sets out the framework of learning your child will be exposed to. These maps set out how learning will be delivered across the curriculum through a specific context. For example, Year 2 will be using the theme 'Our Community (past and present)' and Year 4 have 'Explorers and Journeys'. Staff use these themes to support the delivery of academic, health, culture and communication lessons. All parents have been sent their child's Theme Map for Summer Term via Study Bugs. They are also available on the Kensington Primary School website. Please do take some time to look at this to be more aware as to what your child(ren) will be learning this term!

This week (on Wednesday) we welcomed our governors into the school all day. It was a great opportunity for them to meet children, speak to staff and parents, and meet with the senior leadership team. Governors play an important role in ensuring the school runs smoothly and we thank them all for their excellent support.

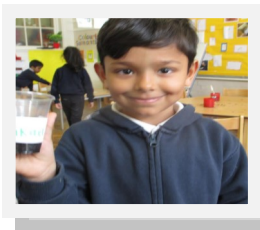


Star Learners this Week are:

STAR LEARNER OF THE WEEK Year 2 - 3

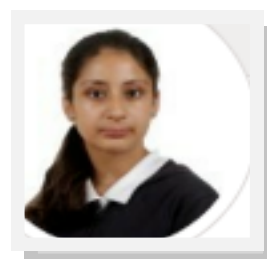
