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Energy	<p>Switch off energy fortnight Campaign</p> <p>Audit of energy appliances around the school.</p> <p>Record the meter reading before and after. Eco-warriors present an assembly about energy to the school.</p> <p>Science lesson linked to energy taught across the school.</p> <p>No electricity day.</p>	<p>Record meter before and after, calculate energy saved.</p> <p>Regular checks made by Eco-warriors to see whether appliances are being switched off.</p> <p>Evidence in books</p>	November 2017	<p>Staff</p> <p>children</p> <p>Eco-warriors</p>	<p>The results of our meter reading showed that on a normal day our school uses £33 worth of electricity and with the lights off, it resulted in us using only £21 worth of electricity, a saving of £12 per day and approximately 36% of electricity. We have also been able to change the mind-set of our pupils and families as they regularly switch off appliances and lights.</p> <p>If we compare our results to last year's findings where we were using £49 worth of electricity to this year of £33, reduction of £16.</p>
